CFO Report: December 12, 2016

- Vendor detail and warrants paid through 12/5/16 are included in the Consent Agenda Portion of the 12-12-16 BOD agenda packet.
- I have scheduled meeting with our auditor and bookkeeper on 12-14-16. Key topics of discussion will relate to: aligning our current financial procedures to conform with best practice and audit guidelines, reviewing her "check list" of best practice procedures that she has developed over the years for special districts, looking at our QuickBooks set up to insure that it will align with what we want to see when we separate from the county, getting her suggestions on making our monthly financial reports more user friendly for board consumption.
- The County transferred \$133,859 into our County treasury account on November 23<sup>rd</sup> from the CSA-40 account. Together with the \$198,923 carried over from our FY 15-16 closing balance, we effectively started FY 16-17 with \$332,782. This amount easily covers our cash flow through January 2017, when we will receive our first direct transfer of funds from property tax revenues from December 2016 collections.
- Annapolis Station Lease with County: Phone call with Marc MacDonald on 12/5 now appear to have us moving again. He was struggling with finding as basis for recommendation on what to charge when he reports this item to the BOS for their approval.
- FY 16-17 Adjusted Budget to Actual for the period is attached. Our ad hoc budget group met on 12/4 to review current adjusted budget and how we want to approach a number of items in the future. You will note that the budget does not yet reflect the recent board action to increase our legal expense to reflect the cost of projected EFAF litigation costs. We have identified areas in the expense side of the budget where funds can be adjusted to supplement additional ERAF legal expense, but thought it wise

to refrain from making those adjustments until after we see revenue from our property tax collections that will appear in January. Expect to see all of this reflected in the February FY 16-17 Adjusted Budget update. The monies from the "true-up" of the CSA-40 account for FY 15-16 are reflected in the income side of the attached report.

- CALFIRE contract. We received an informal report form CALFIRE regarding expenditures relating to our contract for this year. A very helpful document and much appreciated.
- As of this report, I'll be forwarding this report and attachments to our auditor, so that they may have a record of what has been sent to the BOD, which informs their review of actions as it relates to items they verify in their audit procedures.
