Who Responds to Emergency Calls?

- North Sonoma Coast Fire (NSCFPD)
- CAL FIRE
- Coast Life Support District (CLSD)
- Sonoma County Sheriff
- California Highway Patrol
- Mutual Aid: Timber Cove Fire, Fort Ross Fire, South Coast Fire (Gualala), Redwood Coast Fire (Point Arena), Northern Sonoma County (Geyserville)

What Is NSCFPD?

- North Sonoma Coast Fire Protection District was formed on April 1, 2016
- Includes the Sea Ranch, Stewarts Point, and Annapolis areas
- 172.4 Square Miles
- Includes areas previously served by TSRVFD and Annapolis VFD

- 18 volunteer firefighters and/or EMTs and 4 support members
- 5 CAL FIRE personnel, minimum of 2 on duty 24x7
- Fire Chief Bonnie Plakos

- Fire Captains Paul Plakos, Chuck Breier
- CAL FIRE Captain Red Miller, 4 Engineers
- District Board has 5 members

North Sonoma Coast Volunteer Firefighter Association

- Our associated 501(c)(3) nonprofit
- Formed in 1973
- NSCVFA owns and maintains the North Fire Station on Highway 1.
- Provides equipment, training, clothing, or anything needed by the volunteer firefighters
- Sponsors Memorial Weekend picnic, Christmas
 Tree sales
- VFA Board has 5 members

North Sonoma Coast Volunteer Firefighter Association

- In recent years NSCVFA has funded:
 - North Fire Station (NFS) residing and addition of internal stairway
 - Repair and improvement of NFS pavement
 - Repair and improvement of septic system
 - All payments on Rescue 4433 since 2017
 - Seven new water tanks in Annapolis area
 - "Rescue Randy" training manikin
 - Assorted shirts/hats/etc. items for firefighters

NSCFPD Information

- NSCFPD contracts with CAL FIRE for 24x7 coverage
- NSC Volunteers and CAL FIRE respond together as one fire department
- CAL FIRE also provides administration, training, inspections, vehicle maintenance...
- Mutual and Automatic Aid agreements with neighboring agencies
- Dispatched by "REDCOM" in Santa Rosa
- Funding source is ad valorum property taxes, donations, and some rental revenue

- One water tender

The non-profit Sea Ranch Volunteer Fire Department is now the North Sonoma Coast Volunteer Firefighter Association (NSCVFA). The new name reflects the relationship between the nonprofit North Sonoma Coast Volunteer Firefighter Association and the North Sonoma Coast Fire Protection District. The creation of the North Sonoma Coast Fire Protection District merged the Annapolis Fire Brigade and The Sea Ranch Volunteer Fire Department geographic areas into a district with a single fire department. This provides a more responsive local fire department and better emergency services for local residents. The NSCVFA supports the fire department by providing and maintaining the North Fire Station, raising money for the upgrading of firefighting equipment and assisting with the purchase of new emergency response vehicles.


Coast Life Support District (CLSD)
